Soy sourcing and traceability data

In the last six months, Glencore Agriculture has continued working on traceability and supplier engagement in the Cerrado as part of its work under the Soft Commodities Forum.

The focus has been on increasing direct sourcing from farmers from 43% in 2018 to 65% in 2019. We strive to further increase the share of our direct sourcing in the 25 SCF priority municipalities, and beyond, and to engage with our suppliers to improve their practices and administrative processes.

Recently, we have also launched an initiative to further integrate our traceability systems with relevant external databases to improve our monitoring practices and help us increase traceability across our sourcing programmes. We are confident this work, coupled with the collective efforts under the SCF, will help us achieve

our traceability to farm target for direct supplies, both within and beyond the 25 PMs.
