

Soy sourcing data

Glencore Agriculture has focused on engaging with key stakeholders at either end of the supply chain – from producers to end customers. Mutual understanding of the challenges each of our stakeholders face is vital to create cooperation, to implement a successful strategy and ultimately to achieve progress.

Our direct sourcing in Cerrado from the 25 priority municipalities was 42.9% in 2018 of which 99.4% is traceable to a farm with a known CAR-registration or known GPS coordinates. The remainder comes from producers with leased land.

We also took a deeper look at our indirect suppliers. 29.8% (of the 57.1% indirect

supplies, 17.0% of total of the 25 priority municipalities) is originated from cooperatives. Cooperatives are an important factor in any agricultural market and reinforce the strength of the region by supporting their (smaller) producers with knowledge and market access. All the cooperatives we work with have known origin with confirmed producer registrations.

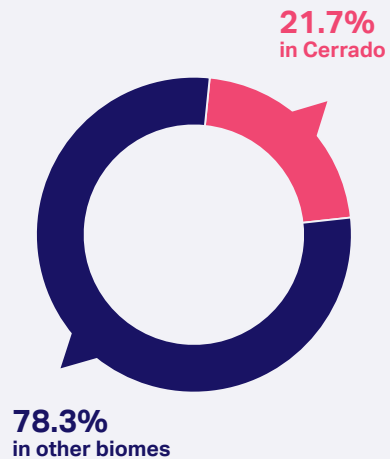

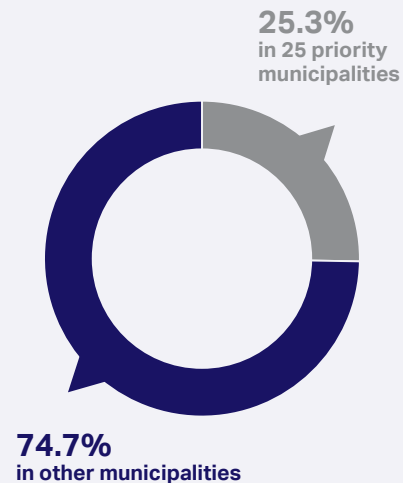

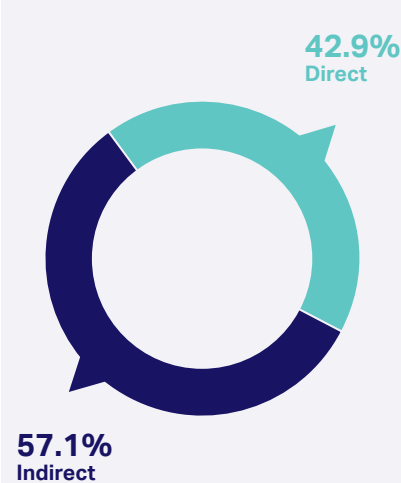
Soy volume sourced in Brazil
